

REPORT OF THE AD HOC COMMITTEE ON MINORS

Guidelines Governing the Minor Option

1. A minor will consist of a minimum of 18 units of upper division work.
2. Only one lower division course may be used to satisfy the 18 unit requirement for a minor.
3. Only one course can be used to satisfy the requirements of both a major and a minor field.
4. No course can be used to satisfy the requirements of more than one minor.
5. A student may obtain more than one minor provided the applicable guidelines are allowed.
6. Transfer units will not normally be used to satisfy minor requirements. Exceptions will require approval by the student's adviser and the Majors and Courses Subcommittee.
7. Students in the College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences may obtain a minor in another college provided that the minor program has been approved by the Academic Senate Committee of that college.
8. Satisfactory completion of a minor program shall be certified by the student's adviser. A student wishing to have a program certified and entered onto a transcript shall obtain the appropriate form from the Dean's office, obtain certification from his/her adviser and return the form to the Dean's Office. The filing deadline shall coincide with the deadline for filing the Major Certification (form D3999).
