Last Updated: Oct 7, 2023

Is the student a danger to self, or others, or does the student need immediate assistance for any reason?

“YES”

The student's conduct is clearly and imminently reckless, disorderly, dangerous, or threatening and is suggestive of harm to self or others in the community

“I AM NOT SURE”

The student is exhibiting concerning behaviors and I am worried they may be a danger to themselves or others but I am not sure how serious it is.



For students in distress

The student shows signs of distress (e.g., signs of depression or anxiety, recent trauma, deteriorating academic performance, etc.), but I am not sure how serious it is. My interaction has left me feeling uneasy and/or concerned about the student.

For students showing
disruptive or threatening
behavior

The student exhibits disruptive behavior (e.g., violating boundaries, intimidating or threatening behavior, expressing thought of harm.)
