







University Requirements



Unit Requirements

Full-Time Student

- 12 units per quarter
- Required for Student Housing, Visa/Status, Scholarships, etc.


Minimum Progress

- 13 units per quarter (average)
- 39 units per year or Subject to Disqualification

Expected Progress

- 15 units per quarter
- 45 units per year for 4 years

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


Degree Requirements: CA&ES



College Requirements


- **No foreign language requirement**, except International Ag Development major
- **No more than 1/3 of your total units P/NP**
- **College Composition**
 - 3 Options – Must receive C- (or P) or better
 1. 2 courses from: ENL3; UWP1, 18, 19, 101, 102, or 104 series; or one course from this list and one from: NEM150 + COM1-4, NAS5, CMN1
 2. AP English of 4 or 5 (or an IB score) + one from above (except UWP1 or ENL3)
 3. Pass the English Composition Exam after completing 70 units

Verbal


- Speak up during large group discussions

First-Quarter Scheduling

- **Your responsibilities as a student**
 - **Seek advising, use office hours, FREE tutoring in advising centers and SASC, know deadlines**
- **Deadlines: 10 day vs 20 day drop (page 80)**
- **Balanced Schedule**
- **Enroll in appropriate UWP/English course**

UWP and Composition Series

English Language Placement Exam (ELPE)
ELPE score determines course placement.



Fall Schedule - AP/IB Exams

- Check for equivalencies/duplicate credit (see pages 68 & 69)
- Common duplication credit:
 - AP English (4,5): **do not register** for ENL 3 or UWP 1
 - AP Micro/Macro Econ (3,4,5): **do not register** for ECN 1A/1B
 - AP Psychology (5): **do not register** for PSC 1
- AP/ IB scores DO NOT count toward GE
- AP/IB scores DO count toward total units for graduation

Be cautious of these courses for the fall:



- **ECN 1A**
- **ECN 1B**
- **PSC 1**
- **STA 13**
- **SOC 1**
- **VEN 3**
- **FST 3**
- **BIS 2A**
- **Upper Division: Do NOT register for any upper division (100-199) or graduate level (200+) courses**


